For the first time, thanks to the efforts of a coalition of citizens, there will be an online Voter’s Guide for the issues on the ballot, in addition to the candidates. Per the auditor’s office, the Canvassing Board has approved Administrative Rules for an Online Voters’ Guide. They will begin accepting statements for ballot measures for the 2014 Primary Election.

Two Initiative Petitions for City of Sequim need signatures

Only four states in the United States have larger public sector union membership than our state. Washington conservatives cannot hope to significantly advance freedom without weakening public sector unions. Sequim is one of four Washington cities where ballot measures to curb union power are in progress. What is Worse Than Kelo-Style Takings?

In an unpublished decision, a Washington Court has reaffirmed that the worst area of eminent domain law is so-called “regulatory takings.” After buying eight lots and building four houses, Whatcom County pulled the rug out from under Robert Matichuk. The County changed its zoning law, making three of his remaining lots into parks.

Well, not technically into parks. If the County had done that, it would have been required to pay “just compensation” to Matichuk. Instead, the County changed zoning to make it illegal to build houses on the three

lots. In that case, as the Court of Appeals, Division I, affirmed, Matichuk gets nothing. The decision was written by Judge Robert Leach and joined by Judges Stephen Dwyer and James Verellen.

The result is unfair and the incentives created by this legal rule are perverse.

When government builds a road or school, it can take private property based on the rationale that the government action will benefit the public. When government zones a parcel of land to limit its use, the rationale is—or ought to be—the same. Yet in one case, the public bears the cost and, in the other, the private landowner bears the cost.

That is not only unfair, but distorts the decision-making process. Because politicians and the public do not bear the costs, they have little incentive to take care or to use this power sparingly.

The case of Kelo v. New London, where a neighborhood was wiped out by local government acting on behalf of Pfizer in a scheme to drive up tax revenues, created public outrage. Yet the bad law affirmed in Kelo is, in fact, better for private property owners than the rule reaffirmed in the case of Robert Matichuk v. Whatcom County.

A Special Request for Clallam Republicans

The brave & willing have declared their candidacies and campaigns are underway. It's important for all of us who consider ourselves Republicans to assist Republican candidates in any way we can. If you like a candidate for a non-partisan office, you also may include them in your efforts.

First, inform yourself about our candidates, then pass on that information to anyone willing to listen. A good place to start is the candidates' website. If you want more info, call or email the candidate directly, they will welcome your interest. Candidate contact info is publicly available on the county elections department website or by calling CCRP at 417-3035.

Second, knocking on doors and getting face to face contact is the most effective way to make an impression on voters. It takes 30 phone calls or 28 mailers to have the same effect on a voter as one face to face contact. Door knocking is not in everyone's comfort zone, but once you get over the initial reluctance, it can be fun. Bring a friend and make it a challenge. Candidates need and want your help and are willing to help you in any way they can, so ask them for their suggestions. They can tell you where your effort will best serve the campaign.

Third, host an informal meet & greet at your home. Invite as many of your friends, relatives and neighbors as you are comfortable hosting. It doesn't have to be elaborate or expensive. Everyone likes free food so consider providing one or more of the following; cookies & coffee, donuts & milk, appetizers & soda, hot dogs & beer/soda, wine & cheese or whatever you like. Most candidates will be able to pay or defray your expenses. Consider inviting multiple candidates to the same event. Coordinate with candidate(s) before scheduling. Not sure of the weather or your house is too small? Make it

EDITORIAL: Dire climate-change predictions just a distraction

With the midterm elections less than six months away and Democrats rightly feeling the heat on multiple fronts, it's hardly a surprise that their most fearless leaders, President Barack Obama and Sen. Harry Reid, once again are raising the temperature on climate change rhetoric. The strategy is obvious: If you can't win the arguments that Americans actually care about, then throw out as many other distractions as possible to deflect attention from those arguments.

Global warming is the distraction du jour. Earlier this month, the White House pivoted to the release of the latest National Climate Assessment. As noted in a Wall Street Journal editorial, the president told NBC weatherman Al Roker that climate change "is not some distant problem of the future. This is a problem that is affecting Americans right now." Of course it is.

Let's check the gospel of Al Gore, former vice president and current pope of the Church of Climate Change:

In 2006, Mr. Gore said, "Many scientists are now warning that we are moving closer to several 'tipping points' that could — within as little as 10 years — make it impossible for us to avoid irretrievable damage to the planet's habitability for human civilization." So it would appear we only have two years left to avoid that dire warning.

In 2007, Mr. Gore went before Congress and said, "The planet has a fever. If your baby has a fever, you go to the

doctor." In response, RightSide-News.com cited a classic "Saturday Night Live" skit: "It sounds like what Al Gore needs is more cowbell."

Then, in 2008, Mr. Gore stated, "Some of the models suggest that there is a 75 percent chance the entire north polar ice cap, during some of the summer months, could be completely ice-free within the next five to seven years." That would be right about now. Yet from 2012 to 2013, Arctic ice expanded by more than 50 percent, and The Washington Post reported in September that Antarctic sea ice levels had expanded to record levels for the second straight year.

Just two weeks ago, Majority Leader Reid, D-Nev., on the floor of the Senate, proffered this laughier full of hot air: "While the Koch brothers admit to not being experts on the matter, these billionaire oil tycoons are certainly experts at contributing to climate change. That's what they do very well. They are one of the main causes of this. Not a cause, one of *the* main causes."

Again, even the liberal Washington Post wasn't buying that, with Glenn Kessler's Fact Checker giving Sen. Reid's claim three Pinocchios on a scale of 1 to 4. That's because Koch Industries, while rating 27th on the list of "greenhouse" polluters, emits about one-third of 1 percent of total greenhouse gases in the United States — while gainfully employing 60,000 Americans, many

in very good-paying jobs that send plenty of taxpayer dollars to the federal government.

Climate change is the religion of environmentalism. Many on the secular left love to pile on people of faith while worshipping at the altar of Mother Nature. As a matter of faith, they believe in all the tenets of radical environmentalism. It's a religion in itself, but its congregation isn't growing. In a March Gallup poll of Americans' biggest concerns, unemployment, jobs and the economy dominated, while climate change didn't even make the list.

Clearly, the alarmism isn't ringing true. Voters are all about jobs and the economy, and they have been since the day President Obama took office. Distractions notwithstanding, Democrats will find that out in November.

IRS Holds Off -- for Now -- on Rules to Restrict Political Groups

Any day that the Obama administration halts its regulatory overreach is a good day – even if it won't last forever.

Yesterday, the IRS announced it would hold off until next year on new rules that would have restricted the activities of nonprofit groups. The administration had been working on these behind the scenes since last year. But after the agency's targeting of conservative groups – based on their ideological leanings – came to light, it caused an uproar.

Heritage legal expert Hans von Spakovsky told The Foundry:

The announcement by the IRS that it intends to rethink its proposed rules on political activity by advocacy organizations is welcome news. These rules would have se-

verely restricted their First Amendment rights and violated Supreme Court precedent. They were an attempt to implement the "inappropriate criteria" disgraced IRS official Lois Lerner used to target tea party and other conservative organizations.

It's at least somewhat refreshing that the agency paid attention to a massive outpouring of criticism. Von Spakovsky had noted recently:

By February 27, 2014, the deadline for public comments, the IRS had received more than 150,000 comments—the vast majority of them negative—which is a record number for an IRS rulemaking. In fact, according to IRS Commissioner John Koskinen, this was more than double the number of public comments that the Treasury Department and the IRS had received for all of their "draft proposals over the last seven years."

Why were people so up in arms? As von Spakovsky said, these rules would institutionalize the types of practices the IRS had been using to target organizations inappropriately – which were violating Americans' First Amendment rights. True to the administration's pattern, the rules would have gone beyond the IRS's authority, as well.

"The IRS should not attempt to regulate in areas beyond its expertise and authority," von Spakovsky said in his analysis of the proposed rules, noting that the agency "is ill-equipped to take on the role of political arbiter that it seems so eager to assume."

But be warned: IRS officials said their rewrite is "certainly is not start-

ing over and certainly not starting from scratch," reports Politico. The new proposal should come out next year, and Americans will have to be ready to defend their freedoms – again.

Primary Election Takes Shape

With candidate filing week over, the August 5th Primary Election takes shape for Clallam County. The ballot will include the 6th Congressional District for the seat held by Derek Kilmer. Both 24th Legislative seats will appear on Primary Ballot. The County Commissioner District 3 seat held by retiring Commissioner Mike Doherty will appear only in the 3rd District in the Primary Election, but countywide for the General. The Prosecuting Attorney race will appear on both the Primary and General Election. All are partisan offices.

Three precinct committee officer races will appear on ballots within their precincts. Bell Hill and Prairie South will vote on a Republican officer. Deer Park will elect a Democratic officer. All other precinct committee officers positions only had one candidate. Per state law, they are deemed elected and will receive a certificate from the county auditor. All other contests and candidates are non-partisan and have less than three candidates. They will only appear on the General Election ballot in November.


